






A lot of work went into moving all the books and shelves and curriculum and other supplies from the old school to the present location.



#### SLIDELL CHURCH OLDEST MEMBER PASSES

Elsie Neyrey was born July 26, 1926, the second child to Joseph Neyrey and Susan Davidson Neyrey. She had one older brother, Joseph A Neyrey, Jr., who became an architect, and sadly he passed away in the late 1990s. Elsie passed away on July 19, 2022.

Elsie went on a blind date, set up by a friend, with Casper P. Gelbke, Jr. They dated and quickly became an item. Elsie went to work at Whitney Bank in the office. The War was moving along and Casper received his draft card. He was going to Dentistry School – but sadly he never was able to come back to it. He asked Elsie to marry him before he left for the war, July 7, 1943. They married at 19.

Elsie went to work for Higgins in the office. Higgins built boats for the war. When Casper finally came back – he could not keep his mind on his school work. So he tried selling things: insurance and several other things until he got a job at Jax Brewery. He made a wonderful salesman. Elsie and Casper became parents to their first child in 1950, a boy, Casper Phillip III, and before two years were up, another boy, Kenneth Joseph in 1952. A baby girl came a bit later in the end of 1958 – the girl they were waiting for, Susan.

Elsie started working outside the home again, at Scalfani's in the office. She always loved entertaining and cooking and having dinner parties, which she did often. When Casper, Sr. passed in 1991, 31 years ago — it devastated her. Depressed, she was able to get thru by making new friends and traveling — China, Alaska, Europe and Panama Canal. She was an excellent seamstress and even made all the bridesmaid dresses for a friend's wedding.

Elsie attended a Revelation Seminar at the New Orleans First Church in the late 1980's, and became a member. She would tell everyone about Jesus and his love. She later moved to the Northshore and joined the Slidell Church where she had her membership until her death. She held many offices in the church during her time there. She loved hosting the monthly Women's Ministry Prayer Breakfast. She always sent in articles for the Slidell monthly newsletter and as her health failed, and the Pandemic came along, she missed being able to attend church and see the members. She did get to come one last time to the Slidell Church's 50th Anniversary service in March 2022. She was so happy to be able to be with her church family on such a high day.

Elsie is predeceased by her parents, her husband and son Kenneth. Elsie leaves to mourn, one son, Casper Phillip, one daughter, Susan, in laws, grandson and many, many friends and church family members.
